EVA JOHNSTON LEAVES A LEGACY OF SERVICE TO NFMC

With the May 15th passing of Eva H. Johnston, the Federation at all levels lost a long-time member and a tireless worker. Even through a number of years of declining health, Eva continued to work on her Federation projects as long as she was able, leaving in progress her final undertaking - "A Pictorial History of NFMC."

A long-time member and past president of the Huntsville Music Study Club, Eva was also an active member of both AFMC and NFMC. She served the state federation in a number of different capacities, including treasurer and Past Presidents Assembly Chairman. She spent ten years as a NFMC board member-at-large, and served as the NFMC Historian and PPA Chairman.

Her obituary in the *Huntsville Times* observed, "Music and other arts were always a vital part of her life. She enjoyed playing the piano, organ, and singing in the church choir. She was actively involved in church music, the Huntsville Symphony Orchestra, the Huntsville Arts Council, as well as the National and Alabama Federation of Music Clubs. She served on numerous councils and in 1970 was awarded the coveted (Huntsville) Virginia Hammil Simms Memorial Award for work in the Arts."

Eva's survivors include Stephen L. Johnston, her husband of 67 years, and three children: daughters Susan Campbell of Montgomery and Virginia Anthony of Maryland, and son Stephen L. Johnston, Jr. of Huntsville. All three are Alabama NFMC Life Members.

In Federation meetings, Eva left no doubt how she felt about any issue being discussed; but whether agreeing with her or not, none who knew her well ever doubted her love for the Federation and her devotion to doing what she could to see its goals accomplished. The materials she had assembled for the unfinished "A Pictorial History of NFMC" have already been sent to the National Federation Headquarters for processing into the NFMC archives and will be available to whomever is assigned the completion of her project.

AFMC WELCOMES THE AUBURN MUSIC CLUB

AFMC is delighted to announce that the Auburn Music Club has completed its federation process, and is pleased to welcome the AMC members to the Alabama Federation and the National Federation of Music Clubs. The current Auburn club roster includes forty-five members. Mike and Cathy Golden are co-presidents for the 2013-14 club year.

The Auburn Music Club was officially founded on January 30, 1980, and has continued as an active part of the Auburn music scene since that time. According to Linda Anderson, the club's immediate past president, "Throughout the club's thirty-three history it has continued to fulfill beautifully it mission of 'encouraging interest and participation in all areas of music and promoting musical endeavors in the community, homes and schools.'"

For its regular meetings, the club enjoys the use of Auburn's Nunn Winston Annex in Kiesel Park. As a result of the club's 1989 donation of a grand piano to the city of Auburn, the facility is available, rent-free, to the club. The piano is housed at this location and is available for use by the AMC for its meetings. Nearby Auburn University guarantees the club a source for outstanding music programs, and the club's yearbook lists a number of presentations by Auburn music faculty members as well as students from the music department. Other programs featured club members, the club chorus and a handbell choir.

Following the lead of AMC, the Auburn University Music Department has already completed the federation process to become an AFMC/NFMC student/collegiate club, thereby qualifying Auburn's music students to participate in the annual AFMC scholarship auditions to be held next March and to enter the NFMC Student/Collegiate award competitions.

Former AFMC Presidents Gayle Baker and Margie Garrett attended AMC's May meeting to meet club members, answer their questions and present them a brief orientation to the Federation. AFMC members look forward to the new association with the Auburn club members and to seeing many of them at the state meetings.

CLUB RECOGNTION CERTIFICATES

At the 2013 AFMC Convention held in Gadsden last April, Citations Chairman Gayle Baker presented Certificates of Recognition to all twenty-three of Alabama's federated clubs. The certificates represented 379 items of participation in forty categories of club work; individual club listings ranged from 2 to 37. The total number of listings consisted of 242 in recognition of the reports which all of the local clubs submitted and 137 which recognized club activities in fifteen special categories of work. Twenty-three of the local clubs participated in at least one of the special activities.

ALABAMA STATE CONVENTION HOSTED BY GADSDEN MUSIC CLUB by Carol Larkins

In the City of Champions on the banks of the Coosa River, where "Music is ALIVE!" Gadsden Music Club hosted the Alabama Federation of Music Clubs Ninety-seventy Annual Convention on April 19-20,2013 at the Mary G. Hardin Center for Cultural Arts. Judy Hicks meticulously conceived and executed an outstanding convention. The Cultural Arts Center was abuzz with laughter and noshing as the fifty-seven attendees met and greeted old friends and made new ones.

The formal opening of the Convention began at noon with our processional hymn "God of Our Fathers," directed by Kristen Dunn, accompanied by Sharron Yancy (piano), Rachel Elkins (one of the Gadsden Music Club scholarship winners this year), John Hefner, and Taylor Fortenberry (trumpet).

Preceding the memorial service that was held at the First United Methodist Church, Catherine Heeman, organist and the Mary Vick Student/Collegiate Audition first place winner of the AFMC/Sarah Caldwell Lee Award, presented a wonderful concert of Sonata V by Felix Mendelssohn and "Aria on a Chaconne" by Joel Martinson.

The processional hymn, "For All the Saints," was directed by DeLeath Rives. Anna Mullin, soprano, sang "O Divine Redeemer" by Charles Gounod. Bill Peoples, AFMC Chaplin, led the memorial service honoring State members who passed away last year. Benny McNair, organist, provided an inspiring conclusion to the service with "The Lord's Prayer" and "O God, Our Help in Ages Past." The memorial service was televised by a local station and highlighted Catherine Heeman.

The Friday evening banquet, held at the Cultural Arts Center, honored AFMC Club presidents. The tables, decked with white tablecloths, colorful netting, flowers, and blue and gold favors, were lovely. Jan Hill, Alabama's Representative on the NFMC Board, was out Mistress of Ceremonies. As usual, she kept us delightfully entertained with her witty repartee. A delicious meal of chicken or fish stuffed with spinach and artichokes was served. Throughout the banquet music gently wafted through the air as we were entertained by the Etowah Youth Orchestra.

Jan then introduced Carolyn Nelson as our guest speaker. After the banquet activities, members enjoyed a recital by AFMC Junior and Collegiate Audition winners - Mira Walker, winner of the Mabry Miller Award (First Place Piano); Abigail Rankin, violinist, winner of the Huntsville Music Study Club Award (First Place Strings); Leah Doss, soprano, winner of the AFMC/Willis and Mary Harris Award (First Place Woman's Voice); Jenny Maclay, clarinetist, winner of the AFMC/Lois Pile Award in honor of Ann Baughman (First Place Woodwind); Alexis Taylor Cote, trumpet, AFMC/Robin Rumcie Award (First Place Brass); Wesley Hyde, winner of the Annie Lou Ellis Award (First Place Piano); and Scott O'Toole, marimba, winner of the Bill Peoples Award (First Place Percussion).

On Saturday we gathered once again at the Mary G. Hardin Center for Cultural Arts Center. President Bobbye Guyton's call to order was followed by a prayer and the singing of the State song "Alabama." Kristin Dunn, accompanied by Sharron Yancy, sang the NFMC President's hymn "How Can I Keep From Singing" and the AFMC President's hymn "He Keeps Me Singing."

For our musical interlude, Devin D. Barton, baritone, winner of the Walter Shoemaker Award (First Place Men's Voice) performed. Mr. Barton's magnificent voice and choice of repertoire combined to create a powerful presentation. Dr. Lynn Faulkner, collaborative pianist, was his accompanist. Bravo! and Bravo!!

Following the business session, a buffet luncheon honoring AFMC Officers and Division Chairmen provided delicious choices of pork tenderloin, chicken, vegetables, salad, and desserts. As usual, the door prizes and "opportunities" were a big hit. The gamut of opportunities ranged from clocks to handmade crochet items to a hand blown glass vase to delightful miscellaneous items. Bob Hicks became the auctioneer for several items and a total of \$850 was raised for scholarships.

State Women Composers Chairman Jo Ann Hadaway has notified the Huntsville Music Study Club that it has won the NFMC Cash Award for its October 2012 program on Music by American Women Composers.

The program featured the music of internationally known composer Emma Lou Diemer and included the world premiere performance of "The Creation of God," a work composed by Ms Diemer for words written by Huntsville writer Sara McDaris. The composition was presented by an instrumental ensemble of Huntsville musicians. The program also included additional works by Ms Diemer performed by the HMSC Chorus and other Huntsville vocalists.

Ms Diemer, Professor *emerita* of Composition at the University of Southern California, Santa Barbara, is a former Fulbright scholar. Her works have received awards from Eastman School of Music, the National Endowment of the Arts, the Kennedy Center, and the American Guild of Organists.

The State winner of the National Music Week Junior Essay Contest, Tiffany Dong (Betty's Young Musicians JMC, Berry), read her essay. Samantha Strunk of Pell City won the AFMC 2013 poster contest.

A mid-morning highlight was the Honors Recital. Each Junior Counselor could recommend one student who had achieved a superior rating at Junior Festival to display his/her talent. The

duet solo and included program Rating and Club performances. Achievement Awards were given to those Clubs who excelled in activities promoted by NFC during the past year. Individual awards were presented to Club members who exhibited outstanding achievement in the Junior program.

Chase Nolan and Emily Smith, both students of Mrs. Iva Gardner Wooten, received their fifth Gold Cup, a high honor indicative of talent and dedicated work.

FYI: GOUNOD

^{*}Charles-Francois Gounod was a French composer most well-known for his "Ave Maria" (based on a word by Bach) as well as his opera <u>Faust</u>.

^{*}His mother was his first teacher; he later studied at the Paris Conservatoire.

^{*} He won the Prix de Rome for his cantata Fernand.

^{*}During his four year stay in Italy he studied the sacred works of the 16th century, which he never ceased to cherish.

^{*} He seriously considered joining the priesthood, but changed his mind before actually taking holy orders.

^{*} His "Solennelle" ("Saint Cecelia Mass") established his fame as a noteworthy composer.

^{*} Geroges Bizet was one of his students.

^{*} Fanny Mendelssohn (sister of Felix) introduced the keyboard music of Bach to Gounod, who came to revere Bach. For Gounod "The Well-Tempered Clavier" was "the law to pianoforte study ... the unquestioned textbook of musical composition."

^{*} He lived in England for four years where he became the first conductor of the Royal Choral Society. Much of his music during this period was vocal – although he composed "Funeral March of a Marionette." (This was used as the theme for the television series Alfred Hitchcock Presents.)

^{*} He performed publicly many times with Fernando de Cristofaro, a mandolin virtuoso living in Paris.

^{*} Late in life he returned to writing sacred music. His "Pontifical Anthem ("Marche Pontificale") eventually became the official anthem of Vatican City.
